

UCLA Luskin Leadership Fellows Program

The UCLA Luskin Leadership Fellows Program is a high-level apprenticeship program for exceptional public policy, social welfare and urban planning graduate students. Fellows serve within selected government agencies and nonprofit and civic organizations to work on research, policy, advocacy and applied projects tailored to the students' tracks of study and consistent with the mission and goals of the organization. For each full-year fellowship, student fellows receive tuition remission for the academic year as well as a full-time paid summer position that becomes a part-time paid position to the end of the academic year. Fellows work under the direct supervision of a senior member of the organization's staff with guidance from a participating faculty member. These are full-year, \$25, 000 to \$30,000 fellowships for continuing students.
