

Undocumented/DACAmented Applicant Frequently Asked Questions

• Can non-residents, non-visa holders apply to the MPP program?

Yes! There are no citizenship requirements to apply to the MPP Program.

- Are undocumented/DACAmented applicants evaluated differently than legal residents? No. Background information and residency/citizenship status are not part of the application review process and have absolutely no bearing on an applicant's admission decision.
- What resources are available to undocumented/DACAmented students at UCLA? UCLA is committed to ensuring that all students, regardless of their citizenship status, are receiving the resources that they need. The Undocumented Students Program serves as a hub to provide resources and support to all Undocumented/DACAmented students.
 - What financial aid available to undocumented/DACAmented students?

All financial aid opportunities are available to Undocumented/DACAmented students. All departmental merit based fellowships, TAships, and RAships do not have citizenship as a requirement. For need based aid, applicants should fill out a Dream Act application instead of a FAFSA.

• Are there different application requirements for undocumented/DACAmented students?

No. The application is the same for all applicants. The welcome screen of the application will provide additional guidelines to those who are uncertain how to discuss their citizenship status.
