Present	<p>The Effect of the Arrest Process and Incarceration on Black Men, Graduate Research Assistant - Dr. Vickie Mays, UCLA</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • My team and I are studying the effects of stop, frisk, arrest, and incarceration on the mental health of Black men. I am responsible for forming the concepts that we analyze in our papers and conducting literature reviews to help inform and support our final analysis. Additionally, I am one of the authors on three of the papers that we are in the process of writing.
2020-2023	<p>Transitional Age Youth Reentry Study, Graduate Research Assistant, Dr. Laura Abrams and Dr. Elizabeth Barnert, UCLA Geffen School of Medicine</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Presently, my team and I are measuring the impact of the Whole Person Care (WPC) intervention for transition-age youth (TAY) exiting the adult criminal justice system in reducing substance use and recidivism, examining social

networks as a potential mediator. Additionally, we are identifying effective approaches for TAY based on their community health service utilization as well as the impact of COVID on reentry overall.

- 2020-2021 Mental Health Measures for Black Youth Exposed to Urban Community Violence, Graduate Research Assistant, Dr. Michael Lindsey, NYU Silver School of Social Work
- Our team investigated a digital mental health app for school counselors to use with students in grades 5th-12th. Additionally, we are conducting a systematic review that focuses on articles that measure trauma in urban youth who have been exposed to community violence. Our goal is to develop a tool that adequately captures the unique traumatic stress that community violence imposes on urban youth.

- The research investigated the effects of cigarettes, hookah, and electronic nicotine delivery products on air quality. We also assessed the cardiopulmonary effects of these products on primary and secondary users.

- We carried out extensive research on the influence of stress and anxiety on upperclassmen international students at New York University. To understand what was happening with this population we distributed surveys, conducted a literature review.
